

CONTINUA IN LIGHT

A continuum is a continuous path along which an object is transformed, by minute shifts and subtle changes, into its opposite. Darkness becomes light. One fractures into many. Stasis explodes into directional movement. Directional movement loses shape and becomes random. Many small pieces coalesce into one cohesive whole. And then they reverse.

CONTINUA IN LIGHT is a video installation that includes two video projections and nine translucent suspended scrims hung in two triangular formations in front of a larger screen. The scrims are ten feet high and four feet wide. The projected image measures ten feet high by twenty-eight feet wide.

Two side-by-side projectors simultaneously run the video, one from the beginning of the continuum to the end, the other from the end of the continuum to the beginning. Then they reverse. The images are projected onto and through the scrims so they exist in multiple layers. The projected images overlap on the middle of the screen to create even more layers and deeper textures. Process, development, and change exist within continuity – in the light of our world.
